

Care for Creation:

Following on the discussion at the October Congregational Gathering last year concerning some congregational action to address the urgent challenge of climate change by making travel offsets, and the positive response to that from the sisters present, we are now making the following proposal. We have taken into account the comments made in the questionnaire distributed that day and after meeting with the Leadership Team.

March 2015 The Care for Creation group urges each sister to make a voluntary donation to an environmental fund of her choice as one way of counteracting the emission of CO2 into the atmosphere by both planes and cars.

The following environmental organisations have been explored and deemed trustworthy –

There are other appropriate organisations, too, of course.

Donations may also be made on line through the organisations' websites.

The **amount** of the donation would be determined by each sister. \$5 per air flight has been suggested. As cars are the more common form of transport, each sister would determine her personal contribution.

The annual contribution would be sent directly to the organisation chosen, entering it under item **3600**.

In her newsletter of 26 February 2015, Congregational Leader Sister Catherine Reuter urged Sisters to respond to the invitation of the Care for Creation group to make a voluntary donation to an environmental fund, as one small way to offset the emission of CO2 into the atmosphere by planes and cars.

This invitation resulted from a consultation by the Care for Creation group with sisters attending a Congregational gathering and after meeting with the Leadership Team. It was decided that the gift would be on a voluntary basis and the annual amount to be determined by the Sister.
